Subject: September Monthly Report

Calls for Service:

There were 192 calls for service this month. Offense / Incident Report Activity:

09/01/2020. Officer Kucera was dispatched to a residence concerning a juvenile who ran away from home. Multiple officers searched the surrounding area for a short period of time. The juvenile was located walking several streets away from his residence. The juvenile was returned home without incident and left in the care of his family.

09/04/2020. Sgt. M. Pritchard was dispatched regarding an animal bite. Sgt. Pritchard spoke with the victim who claimed that a cat had bitten her on the top of the foot. The victim identified a cat, and the cat was quarantined for the required number of days for observation. Following an investigation, it was unclear as to the actual cat that may have bitten the victim. Despite the differences in witness identification of the animal, the original cat completed the required observation/quarantine period and was cleared. Treating physicians were notified by Chief L. Dick that there was a question as to the actual animal responsible for the bite, and that the treatment of the patient should not be based upon the outcome of this specific animal's observation period.

09/06/2020. Officer Stansberry observed a cow that was out and running through several streets of the city. Ofc. Stansberry was able to locate the owners of the livestock and waited for their arrival to capture the cow. Ofc. Stansberry provided traffic control during the incident, due to the cow running out into traffic multiple times. The livestock was captured and secured by the owners without further incident.

09/10/2020. Officer Kucera responded to call for a burglary of a vehicle at a local hotel. Sometime in the late evening hours a back window was broken, and items were taken from a vehicle that belonged to a guest of the hotel. Although video captured the event, no identifying features were obtained due to the poor quality of video.

09/11/2020. Sgt. N. Pritchard took a report concerning a possible outcry by a juvenile. Upon further investigation it was found that a crime had occurred. The investigation resulted in two warrants being

issued by the District Attorney's Office.

09/12/2020. Officer Llanes was dispatched to a disturbance that had occurred at a residence just outside of the city limits. Upon making contact at the residence, the suspect fled to a travel trailer on the property and barricaded himself inside. Family members present reported that the suspect was known to have a firearm in the trailer. Ofc. George, and Sgt A. Pritchard and Sgt. M. Pritchard were called to assist with the barricaded suspect. After an extended standoff, officers were able to capture the suspect, who was taken into custody by FCSO and transported to jail without any further incident. 09/14/2020. An alert was issued by Fayette County Dispatch concerning a Dodge Minivan that had been reported stolen, traveling East on IH-10. Sgt. M. Pritchard observed the vehicle on IH-10 and conducted a felony stop of the vehicle. After placing the driver of the stolen vehicle in custody, a search of the vehicle found license plates hidden in a newspaper. Those license plates were found to be stolen, as well. The driver was arrested for Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle and Theft of Property. 09/18/2020. Chief Dick responded to call for a controlled burn that had gotten out of control. Chief arrived on-scene and provided a size-up of the situation to responding Fire Department members. Chief Dick utilized the fire extinguisher in his patrol vehicle to keep the fire from spreading in multiple areas. Upon arrival of the first fire apparatus, Chief Dick assisted the single operator of the apparatus by manning a fire hose and extinguishing multiple fires, some in heavy brush that was extremely close to the roadway. Chief Dick remained on scene and continued to help extinguish the remainder of the fire. 09/22/2020. Officer George observed a vehicle that had become disabled on the exit ramp for IH-10. Ofc. George noted that the vehicle was obstructing traffic and he assisted the driver in pushing the vehicle off the ramp and onto the shoulder clearing the obstruction. Ofc. George assisted the motorist in requesting a wrecker and getting his vehicle moved.

Code Enforcement

- Illegal burning was reported, and officers contacted the homeowners who were advised of City Codes regarding burning. The homeowner extinguished the burning without incident.
- Overgrown vegetation was observed at a residence and the homeowner was contacted and advised of the City Code of Ordinances and told to remove the tall vegetation that exceeded 48 inches in height. The homeowner had a crew removing the tall vegetation within a couple of hours of the contact.
- A resident was attempting to tear down a building, within the city limits, without a permit.
 The homeowner was contacted and notified of the need to obtain a construction permit. The homeowner stopped all construction and advised that he would contact the city the next morning to obtain necessary permits.
- After multiple reports of local businesses having trash scattered across their properties, the businesses were advised of the violations and given the appropriate amount of time to address the violations.

<u>Traffic Contacts</u> Officers Made a total of 48 traffic contacts. <u>Reserve Officers Work</u> Reserve officers worked a total of 0 hours.

In-Service Training:

Officers had a total of 66 training hours.

- Efforts to conduct field-based/hands-on training have been hampered by the ongoing COVID pandemic; however, supervisors have continued to give direct feedback and coaching at and following the resolution of actual calls.
- Several officers have continued working to obtain their Intermediate Peace Officer licenses.
 Additional training and continuing education hours have been completed in support of state peace officer licensing requirements.
- Chief Dick has mandated that all officers (including the Chief) complete multiple hours of training in Inherent Bias, De-Escalation, Use of Force, Systemic Racism, and Professionalism. Additional training mandates from the Chief have included courses on written and verbal communications and officer safety. All officers have completed this training mandated by the Chief.
- Final paperwork has been submitted to the state regarding the department becoming a Licensed Training Provider with the State of Texas.

Highlights of 3rd Quarter 2020 Activities:

Visitors:

• Visitors have been sporadic this quarter—at times seeming back to pre-virus levels and at other times very quiet. Those that have come in are usually on day trips just to get out of the house and see something different than their own four walls.

Conservation:

- Completed the transcription of a fragile document in our collection—the small notebook journals kept by Frank Nesrsta (musician and banker) from 1902 through 1904, interspersing his comments regarding local happenings with news articles regarding the same events as reported contemporaneously in the Flatonia Argus.
- Making good progress on a digital inventory catalog, complete with accession numbers, who donated the items and when, along with any history or interesting features and a photograph of the object in each record to help with future identifications.
- Provided scans of a number of historical photographs of Flatonia people and places for use in decorating the new Darlin's Diner.

Other:

- Quarterly board meeting held September 9th, at which time the board voted to cancel our November 7th open house and fundraiser in the Barn due to the Coronavirus pandemic. We will send our usual fundraiser letters offering our customary Flatonia-themed thank you gifts in October but felt we could not plan on holding an in person event this year.
- Received a Covid-19 Small Business Utility Grant from the Flatonia EDC.
- New hotel/motel tax contract with the City signed for one year term, October 1, 2020 to September 30, 2021.
- On September 10th we received the city permit to proceed with converting the storage closet adjacent to our current restroom in the barn to a second restroom which will be ADA compliant.
- New flooring was installed on October 1st in the kitchen/bedroom/restroom area of the barn as a first step in the process for the above-referenced project.

RESOLUTION NO. 2020.10.1

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF FLATONIA, TEXAS, RATIFYING, REINSTATING, CONTINUING AND RENEWING THE DECLARATION OF DISASTER (PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY) SIGNED BY THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF FLATONIA, TEXAS ON MARCH 24, 2020, ATTACHED HERETO, RATIFIED, CONTINUED AND RENEWED EFFECTIVE MARCH 31,2020, MAY 27, 2020 AND JULY 28, 2020 FOR A PERIOD OF SIXTY (60) DAYS EACH, AND BE IT RATIFIED AND REINSTATED THAT SAID DECLARATION OF DISASTER CONTINUE IN EFFECT FOR AN ADDITIONAL PERIOD OF SIXTY (60) DAYS FROM OCTOBER 13, 2020.

WHEREAS, the City of Flatonia, Texas on the 24th day of March 2020, began preparing for widespread or severe damage, injury or loss of life or property resulting from the novel coronavirus (COVID-19), which has been recognized globally as a contagious respiratory virus, and

WHEREAS, it has been and continues to be critical to take additional steps to prepare for, respond to, and mitigate the spread of COVID-19 to protect the health and welfare of Flatonia, and

WHEREAS, continuing the declaration of a state of disaster will facilitate and expedite the use and deployment of resources to enhance preparedness and response, and

WHEREAS, the President of the United States as well as the Governor of the State of Texas have certified that COVID-19 poses an imminent threat of disaster and declared a state of disaster for all counties in Texas on the 13th day of March 2020; and

WHEREAS, Texas Government Code, Section 418.108 requires that the City Council continue any mayoral declaration of disaster when such losses occur or are anticipated to occur under such circumstances; and

WHEREAS, state regulations require that the declaration by the Mayor previously continued or renewed by the City Council of the City of Flatonia, Texas be continued or renewed in order to receive federal or state financial assistance to recoup financial expenditures deployed by the City in the fight against the pandemic;

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Flatonia, Texas, a municipal corporation in Fayette County, Texas, met at a special meeting of the City Council of the City of Flatonia on October 13, 2020 after proper notice and posting required by the Texas Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551, Texas Government Code; and

WHEREAS, a quorum of the City Council of the City of Flatonia, Texas were present at a regular meeting of the City Council held on October 13, 2020; and

WHEREAS, upon motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was unanimously adopted at said special meeting:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF FLATONIA, TEXAS:

- 1. That the Declaration of Disaster, attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as if fully set forth verbatim, continued and renewed effective March 31, 2020, May 27, 2020, and July 28, 2020 for period of sixty (60) days each, and it was ratified, reinstated.
- 2. That said Declaration of Disaster continue in effect for an additional period of sixty (60) days from October 13, 2020 or until the City of Flatonia, Texas is part of a Disaster Declaration by the President of the United States, whichever occurs sooner.
